20 Participants representing 13 nations complete program in terminal management to become poised for leadership roles in the company.

This year's class was accredited by the Institute of Leadership and Management and consisted of classes in Leadership, Finance and Operations; Strategy; two e-learning prepared by Cornell University; 7 internal consultancy projects driven by business demand; and 7 coaching sessions with an executive coach.
