Update – conflict Hamn 4:an and APM Terminals Gothenburg

- Strike Tuesday 24th of May

APM Terminals and the Dockworker's union Hamn 4:an, met on Monday 23th of May to continue the discussions from last week. Even though the discussions have been held in a constructive manner, we have had difficulties to agree on the main items and will consequently face another strike.

This means that the union's 24 hours strike starts at 1600 on Tuesday. Already at 0700 an overtime ban starts which will continue 8 hours after the strike ends on Wednesday 1600.

Both parties are keen on agreeing on terms that will be beneficial for our customers who are the ones suffering the most from this conflict. The parties intend to resume the mediation when the business is operational again without major disruptions.

When the next negotiation will follow is not yet decided.
